Cell Phone/Cell Service: Are you overpaying for your needs

## Cell Service Plan Review

T-Mobile and Sprint have merged to T-Mobile, so Sprint is not included here. Plans may change for T-Mobile as Sprint gets incorporated into T-Mobile. Just looking at major carriers.

## First steps

- Access your cell phone account online by logging in
- Access your most recent bill and view bill details
- Look for three things: Access fee for your phone, Surcharges/fees/taxes, and installment plan payment for your phone (if applicable). Note the fee breakdown.
- Now click on Usage to see how much usage you have of Data, Text and Talk. Note the amount of data being used in each category.
- How many phones or devices are on your plan?
- How do you use your phone? Just calls? Texts? Checking internet/email? Camera?


## How much data do you need?

If you're not using a lot of data, you may not need an unlimited data plan.

- AT\&T
- Unlimited plans - lowest for 1 line is $\$ 65 /$ month (no premium data), $\$ 75$ for 50 GB premium data, $\$ 85$ for 100GB premium data. Versus
- At\&T - mobile share plans - 1 line - $\$ 50 / \mathrm{mo} /$ line with 3 GB data or $\$ 60 /$ month with 9 GB data. Costs go down, per line, with additional lines. Versus
- At\&T has a 2GB Promo Prepaid Plan for $\$ 15 /$ month, and $8 G B$ plan for $\$ 25 /$ month when prepaying for 1 year ( $\$ 300$ ).
- Verizon
- Unlimited plans - lowest for 1 line is $\$ 80 /$ month with no premium data, $\$ 90 /$ month for 25 GB premium data, higher quality streaming, $\$ 90$ and $\$ 100$ for even more. Can save $\$ 10 / m o n t h$ with auto-pay. Versus
- Verizon - Single device plan - \$30 for talk/text, no data (would work for flip phone or similar). OR
- Verizon - Tiered data plan with 5 GB of data and unlimited talk/text is $\$ 55$, with data carryover.
- Verizon offers 8GB data pre-paid plan for $\$ 45 /$ month. "Limited time" offer ups it to 16GB for the same price. Service may suffer during high volume periods.
- T-Mobile (soon to include Sprint)
- Unlimited plans - lowest for 1 line is $\$ 60 /$ month, then $\$ 70$, then $\$ 85$ depending on amount of data.
- For those over age 55 , unlimited plan cost is $\$ 40$ for 1 line or $\$ 27.50 / \$ 35 / \$ 45 /$ month/line for 2 lines.
- T-Mobile offers T-Mobile Connect for $\$ 15 /$ month with 2 GB data cap.
- T-Mobile has 10GB pre-paid plan for $\$ 40 /$ month including fees.


## Cell Phones - Do you really need a (super) Smart Phone with loads of memory?

You can usually find deals offered by the cell carriers when you buy a new phone with activation of new service. Costco has promotions for most phone purchases. You need to shop around
iPhone

- iPhone 11 with 6.1" display, starts at \$699 for 64GB memory, \$749 for 128GB memory

Android Phones

Samsung Galaxy

- Galaxy S20 5G with 128GB memory is \$999.99-6.2 inch display
- Galaxy S10 4G with 128GB memory is \$599.99-6.4" display

Google Pixel 3

- $\quad \$ 799$ with 64GB memory, $\$ 999$ for 128GB memory - 5.5 HD display

Could you do just as well with:

- iPhone SE is brand new with 4.7" HD retina display is $\$ 399$ for 64GB memory, $\$ 449$ for 128GB memory
- Moto G7 - $\$ 229.99$ with 6.2 inch display 32 GB memory
- Google Pixel 3 - $\$ 449.99$ with $64 G B$ memory has a $5.5^{\prime \prime}$ screen (as above) - Verizon has special deal with activation of a cell account.
- Jitterbug Smart2 - \$112.49 (and \$59.99 per month for unlimited talk, text, data through Great Call on the Verizon network. No contract required)
