KWANZAA

Millions of African Americans and others around the world celebrate Kwanzaa, the week-long pan-African holiday. First celebrated in 1966, the holiday is built around African harvest celebrations during the southern solstice. This year's celebration runs from December 26 through January 1.

Kwanzaa celebrations often include songs, dances, African drums, storytelling, poetry reading, and a large communal meal. On each night, a child lights one of the seven candles in the Kinara (candleholder). One of the seven associated principles is discussed, fostering community and cultural heritage. The principles are unity, self-determination, collective work and responsibility, cooperative economics, purpose, creativity, and faith.
